Facts and Figures

-  Patterdale Mountain Rescue Association Limited is a registered charity (No 1063329) and is the administrative organisation of the Patterdale Mountain Rescue Team.
-  Patterdale Mountain Rescue Team is called out to about 70 incidents each year.
-  The Team's area covers about 140 square km of the highest land in England, including Helvellyn, High Street, Fairfield, St Sunday Crag and the wild beauty of Dovedale and Deepdale as well as the quieter valleys and tops of Martindale and Riggindale to the east of Ullswater.
-  Search & Rescue and Air Ambulance helicopters frequently work with the Team on high level incidents or to ensure that casualties reach hospital as quickly as possible.
-  Patterdale MRT's boat, Scotty, was purchased from funds raised by members of the Supporters' Club and others. The boat is used in flood situations and to get Team members to the far side of Ullswater (and back) as this popular area is not served by a road.
-  It takes over a year to train a new member of the Team and equipment for a recruit costs over £1000.
-  Members of the Team train regularly to maintain and develop their mountain, rescue and medical skills. Several members are also qualified emergency off-road drivers, swift water rescuers and powerboat drivers.
-  Patterdale Mountain Rescue Team is one of 11 teams based in Cumbria and one of over 50 across England and Wales. All these teams are staffed by volunteers and funded by donations.
